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OUR EDUCATIONAL HERITAGE



We work closely with our feeder schools to ensure the move up to College is as smooth and successful as possible. We are a member of the Frome Learning Partnership; a team of Frome Headteachers who come to together to make decisions about how to support the young people in our wider Frome community.

We also work closely with Wiltshire and Somerset secondary schools; sharing staff expertise and taking a lead in training teachers new to the profession. We host a variety of local clubs and societies on site including Frome Community Pottery. Our assembly and presentation hall is the Merlin theatre; a space supported by College to deliver drama and theatre to the wider community.

We are very proud that most of our students continue with us into Futures- our post 16 Sixth Form. A separate prospectus and curriculum offer booklet is available on request.



A LOVE OF LEARNING WHICH WILL LAST A LIFETIME

We are passionate about learning. It is at the heart of everything we do.



We don't want students to just learn and pass examinations; we want them to develop a love of learning which will last for a lifetime.

Pre 16 students follow a three year Key Stage four curriculum with at least four options of their choice, plus the national offer. Post 16 students can select from over 40 subjects we offer as A levels, and BTECs. In addition to our curriculum, we teach students how to learn through study skill sessions, which concentrate on research and revision techniques to help build confidence and develop cross curricular skills.

Many of our staff are involved in research projects, or serve as examiners. We spend our training sessions exploring new ideas which will help students to learn better, and groups of staff work together in professional learning communities to test out new ways of learning.

We offer:

- An upgraded IT service for staff and students
- A flexible virtual learning environment for staff, students and parents
- IT rooms and Bring Your Own Device (post 16) study spaces
- An unrivalled curriculum with over 40 subjects on offer
- Special Education Needs support in a dedicated, resourced hub
- A challenging curriculum for our most able students

WELLBEING AND MENTAL HEALTH

Considerate, caring and kind.

We prioritise our students' social and emotional development; we help them look after each other so they can develop and maintain strong, supportive relationships. We believe that mutual respect is the foundation for good relationships and that we should act with care, concern and generosity towards each other- staff and students alike.

Each young person who joins us is placed in one of four Houses named after exemplary role models in the fields of Science and Mathematics: Franklin, Newton, Aristotle and Einstein. Our House system has been in place for over 50 years and means we get to know students well and to ensure the best individual attention. Every young person has a tutor who is the main point of contact; parents are kept informed through regular reviews and meetings.

We provide:

- PHSE (Personal, Health, Social, Emotional education) lessons for all year groups delivered by an expert team of staff
- Mentors and inclusion staff to work with small groups and individual students who are facing challenges
- Interactive sessions on how to deal with anxiety, stress and peer pressure
- Lessons and assemblies on how to use the internet safely

- Counselling support delivered by local and national charities
- Relaxation activities, for example yoga
- Student buddy partnerships
- A dedicated inclusion area for drop ins and appointments
- Regular contact with home so we can all work together



A GREEN COLLEGE: A BRIGHT FUTURE

Our College site is unique and the envy of every school leader who visits us.



We enjoy around 30 acres of campus which has been carefully tended by gardeners for decades, with hundreds of plant and tree species on site. We enjoy assemblies in our European Circle of Stones, now some 40 years old and still looking strong and impressive, whilst our sensory garden has been developed as a place for quietness and reflection.

We are delighted that our young people are increasingly passionate about addressing the challenges of achieving long term environmental sustainability and securing the biodiversity of the Earth. We want to harness this passion and, in our own small way, help our next generation secure their green future.

In order to do this we offer:

- An eco club which works closely with Frome Town Council on reducing our carbon footprint
- Student allotments on site
- Gardening club

- A wildlife garden and pond
- Gardening apprenticeships
- A pledge that our caterers will prioritise the use of local produce

Our student voice group is a well-established body which provides students with a forum for raising new ideas and suggestions that will help the College to progress, and to provide feedback on what we are doing well and what needs to improve.
