

As we approach half term, we can reflect on a hugely successful return to college life for staff and students without the limitations of Covid-19 restrictions. Classroom lessons have been in full flow and after college extra-curricular sessions have resumed with a wide range of clubs and activities on offer. We are also delighted to plan for trips, both national and international, over the course of this academic year.

Year 9 have settled in well to college life and in early October students were treated to a team building exercise of overnight camping and hiking the 5 miles back to college. Fortunately, the weather was mostly dry and mild; well done to all who took part and thank you to those who coordinated the event and ran the activities.

Our TAG, Talented and Gifted Programme, has started the year really well with visiting speakers and events already happening. Equally 'Next Steps', our careers advisory service, is led and manned by some very experienced staff with students benefiting from the opportunities and wise advice they can recommend. At the end of September, Frome College hosted an Open Evening for families to visit our site, meet teachers and speak to students in their classrooms. 




INTRODUCING....

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Our A Level Maths Students have had a busy few weeks.....

On Wednesday 28th September, 4 of Frome College's top female A Level Mathematicians, entered the UKMT Mathematical Olympiad for Girls. This is an extremely challenging competition aimed at girls and young women in the UK designed to promote and celebrate their achievements in mathematics. Maths is often perceived to be a male dominated subject, and the girls conducted themselves exceptionally well (as always)!

On Tuesday 4th October 2022, 35 of our talented A Level Mathematicians took part in the UKMT Senior Maths Challenge, a competition designed to encourage mathematical reasoning, precision of thought, and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. Congratulations to all who took part, we look forward to receiving the results in a few weeks.





Well done to Mars House who, through a cake decorating stall, raised a whopping £223.95 for their House charity Young Somerset.
















Sporting News
