



55th International Chemistry Olympiad



A-level chemistry students from both Y12 and Y13 took part in the first round of the UK competition in February. The results have been released and certificates were awarded to all students who took part and completed the paper. 20 students took part and received 9 bronze awards, 1 silver and 1 gold, which was a fantastic achievement. Dr Smith said 'the students showed great endeavour and resilience to complete the test paper which contained questions of undergraduate difficulty, whilst being based on the A level chemistry our students have been studying. As a department we considered it important to revitalise our Chemistry Olympiad participation, which we hadn't entered for a few years, and it was fantastic to see our students really engage with the challenge and show themselves to be equal to other students across the country. We hope to enter the 56th Olympiad when it opens for applications in October'. Congratulations to Gareth and Melissa who gained gold and silver awards respectively. Over 280 students have participated in a 'Puppy Party' in aid of Guide Dogs UK . Hosted by the students from the talented and gifted programme, students were able to come and interact with twelve guide dogs (either in training or retired) as an exam de-stress day. This event was coordinated by Anna Rose B., a year 12 TAG student, and eight volunteers from the year 9 and 10 TAG programme, helped to run it.



Gemma Spencer, Community Fundraising Relationship Manager for Guide Dog UK, said of the event "Thanks so much for having us in, all the volunteers enjoyed themselves, plus the dogs! We had some lovely feedback that the students are a credit to the College. They were very respectful of the dogs and pups, and were very interested in hearing our stories. £116.85 was raised which was brilliant!".

Talented and Gifted

The TAG programme at Frome College is an intervention programme for students who score in the top 5% of the CATS tests or SATS tests. This is a statistical group and forms the base for our student inclusion in TAG. There are, however, students that for one reason or another do not test into TAG and those students can apply by getting two or more teacher recommendations that state they are working above age/grade level within specific subjects. Students that get these nominations are also put on the TAG register. The programme hosts a series of workshops, talks, field trips, and events aimed at stretching and challenging this group.



21 of our year 9 and 10 TAG students have graduated the Scholars Programme run by 'The Brilliant Club'. Each of these students wrote a 2000-word essay on contemporary poetry, after 7 tutorials with a PhD researcher. They had a workshop at Bristol University, a tour of the campus facilities and a graduation ceremony where Iris B. and Bas G. represented Frome College and gave speeches about their experiences.

Dyson engineer Sophie Adams came to College to work with a group of our year 9 & 10 students on creating the future of clean air technology. After a brief talk on current solutions to air pollution, students worked in groups of four to create their own versions of new technology that could help to create clean air. Solutions ranged from mini windmills that compress pollutants into building blocks to street lamps that purify smog and flame throwers that do not emit carbon dioxide for agricultural use. Thank you to the James Dyson Foundation for an amazing workshop!









Lysander Law's Claire Levene gave a talk to 112 of our year 9 and year 10 students on career paths in law. Students learned the difference between solicitors and barristers along with the entry paths into both careers. Ms. Levene's speciality is clinical negligence and she spoke of cases she has personally worked on to help the students get an in depth picture of one speciality they could pursue.

Two teams of year 9 students competed in the Southwest Regional competition for the Underwater STEMhub Challenge at the National Composite Center in Bristol. Teams had to create, program, and design an underwater ROV to detect and collect plastic from the sea. Over the course of the day teams from schools around the Southwest participated in challenges and activities ending with a presentation in front of three judges. Team Mediocrity came in 3rd in the region. Congratulations to all of the teams that took part.



The Frome College team Downpipe Downpipe Doo was one of the 24 finalists in the national Raspberry Pi competition. The team consisted of Jack, Ted, Oren, Jacob, Eric and Thomas who worked for three months creating an invention to transform energy consumption. Their invention was a water wheel that fit in a gutter pipe that could be daisy chained so that water flowing over the water wheel would generate electricity to run small systems such as lights or phone chargers. They were one of 24 teams out of 200 that entered the competition to reach the national final. Congratulations year 9 TAG team of Downpipe Downpipe Doo.

Year 9 **Food Tech** students have been exploring traditional foods. Alongside this they have been exploring new skills such as marinading and making two dishes. In theory lessons they have explored different cuisines; staple foods from around the world; and modern farming, including organic methods. Meanwhile, Year r10 have been starting to prepare for their NEAs worth 50% of their final grade. They have made pasta and pasta sauce of their choice, and needed to either fill, colour, or flavour their pasta. They have also been investigating how to cook the best chip! In theory lessons they have revisited vitamins and minerals and explored why some foods are fortified.

Teacher Reads


We recently asked our teachers to tell us about books they have enjoyed or inspired them. Here are just a few....






