Re: Year 10 Bronze Training, Practice and Qualifying

Summary

The compulsory Expedition training, which included basic first aid and camp craft skills took place in March and April 2021 and participants may have also completed day walks where we practiced some map reading skills and navigation. With the essential training completed, we will start practice expeditions this Autumn, followed by a qualifying expedition in the May 2022.

Equipment

Tents will be supplied for all expeditions. You can use your own but consider the size and weight. No one individual will carry the whole tent.

Trangia Stoves will be supplied to each team with fuel. These are recommended stoves for school groups.

A list of the essential and recommended equipment is available on the college website.

A sturdy water bottle - minimum 1 litre.

Rucksacks

We have available to loan - 65 litre rucksacks suitable to school groups and suitable for those with a small frame. You can use your own, and 65 litres is sufficient for all levels of the award. Rucksacks are not waterproof so sturdy waterproof bags are needed to protect kit.

Note: Full expedition equipment must be brought by each student. The participant may not be able to begin the expedition if the essential equipment is not brought. This is for safety. An equipment list can be found on the College web page under students, extra-curricular.



Footwear

These should be sturdy boots, not slip-ons or trainers. A suggestion is to purchase sturdy boots around Christmas so as not be caught out by the inevitable growth of feet for this age group!

Expedition Food

This was discussed on the training days. It is recommended 3000 – 5000 kcal per day per person. Each participant would need sandwiches or equivalent for 2 days, a substantial, hot evening meal, breakfast (not cooked) and plenty of snacks not just sweets! For safety no raw meats, bacon or fish for the evening meal. A bag to keep all the rubbish for later disposal.

Costs for practice and qualifying expeditions:

Expeditions – campsite fees, fuel for stoves, supporting minibuses, school insurance –

Qualifying £30 – previously paid with registration

Total Cost is £20.00. Please pay using Parent Pay. We will require payment before the first practice camp in September. Pay point letters are available upon request. Please contact the Finance Team on 01373 469006 with any payment queries.

Should you be concerned by the costs, please contact me to discuss. DofE is open to everyone and there are grants and bursaries available to cover costs for those Pupil Premium students.

Travel

Due to such a large number of students signing up to complete the Bronze award travelling to the walks we are asking for help. The college has only two minibuses which limit numbers.

For these practices parents please can you transport your son/daughter to the start/finish point at Winn Green, south of Shaftesbury (SP7 0ES). You can of course organise car share amongst yourselves but we cannot do this. Timings will follow when numbers are confirmed. Note: For those selecting the first camp, (30 Sept) there will be a limited number of places for students where parents have other important commitments.

I would be grateful for your response by 20 September to allow time for planning and to finalise the campsite booking.
